On a stone on the grave of Steven F. Ciulla 2/24/1962 - 9/5/1992 with a picture of him in his uniform engraved on the stone. In checking to determine if Steven Ciulla and Robert Ciulla were brothers I learned that Steven died from a "self-inflicted gunshot wound to the chest. At the time of death he lived at 12 Butler Street, Dorchester. Death Certificate # 006163. Parents: Philip Ciulla & Grace Penza.

On a stone that is flush with the ground and engraved with the laser type engraving there is a picture of a young man of eighteen years doing what many teenagers do, he is smiling while talking on the telephone. The difference here is that Amin Bell will never hang up nor get up. He is destined to be a teenager for eternity.

* On 16 May 1998 during the Ashmont Hill Yard Sale, a woman stopped at our home sporting a tee shirt with Amin's picture and name on its front. I explained how I knew who he was and gave her a copy of my essay entitled "A Morning Run", 24 June 1996, which includes a bit about Amin. She told me the tee shirt is the result of a Scholarship Fund Raiser in his memory.

* On 11 June 1998, WGBH, Channel 2 a program entitled "Basic Black" featured Amin's family and friends and told the story of his life and death. Amin lived in the Orchard Park Housing Project in Roxbury when he was caught between two rival gangs fighting one another with guns and took a bullet in the head. While Amin was in the hospital and declared brain dead, his parents, Walter & Loretta Lewis, with the guidance of the pastor of their church, Gilbert Thompson (he lives at 39 Roslin St., Dorchester), made the decision to donate his organs so that others may live. This also helped them to create some good out of the tragic end to their son's life. His parents, friends and church members all have pleasant memories of a young man who died violently at a young age.

Section 25 Behind Amin Bell and Ngoc Ly rests someone named McDonough and in these three stones you have a microcosm that is representative of Dorchester, that is representative of the World. Here, they and many others share the same earth for eternity without regard to color, race, religion or ethnic origin.

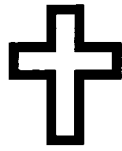

TOMMY MULLEN - MAY 5, 1981 - 1997

Two Wooden Crosses mark the grave of a young man of 15 years from South Boston who was so desperate with his life that he hung himself. Many of his friends signed their names to one of the wooden crosses. The bearers of this information were two young women sitting on the grass beside the grave on 15 May 1997. Scattered around the crosses were several vases or bouquets of flowers, some small white stones with notes and initials and a package of Newport Cigarettes.

On 22 May 1997 there was a large sheet of paper with handwritten notes from some of Tommy's female friends wishing him a Happy Birthday, telling him they will always love and miss him. The cross painted white has a pair of pink rosary bead hung over it and reads:

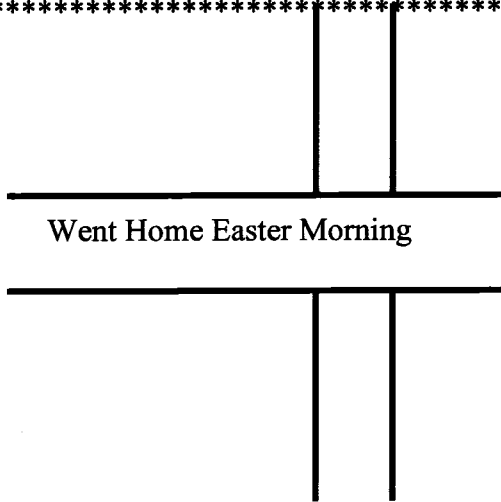
